- › Staff and students in Bergen, Sogndal and Stord.
- › Approximately 160 employees, nearly seven per cent are professors and 69 per cent associate professors.
- › Educations: Kindergarten, **MA teacher education**, BA education in sign language and interpretation.
- › The department has many research groups and is involved in several of the strategic research programs at the Faculty of Teacher Education, Culture and Sports. Our research environment that is known nationally and internationally.
- › The staff at the department publish research that is relevant to our educations and take part in national and international research projects. The department aims to be at the forefront of school and kindergarten-based knowledge development.

MA Teacher Education 1-7 grades – in Bergen

- › **Year 1 and 2 (120 ECT in total)**
 - 3 mandatory subjects: Mathematics (30 ECT), **Norwegian** (30 ECT), Pedagogy and student knowledge (30 ECT)
 - 1 optional subject, 30 ECT (English, Science, Physical education, Religion, Arts and Crafts, Food and Health, Music, Social Science)
- › **Year 3 (60 ECT in total)**
 - Fall: One optional subject
 - Spring: 30 ECT in a subject that qualify for 60 ECT in total in the subject that will be the MA subject
- › **Year 4 (60 ECT in total)**
 - 45 ECT in the MA subject (in Bergen: **Norwegian**, mathematics, English, Science, Physical education, Religion, Arts and Crafts, Food and Health, Music, Social Science, Pedagogy, Special needs education Initial training Norwegian and Mathematics)
 - 15 ECT Pedagogy and student knowledge
- › **Year 5 (60 ECT in total)**
 - 45 ECT MA thesis
 - 15 ECT Pedagogy and student knowledge

Innhald og oppbygging

Norsk 2 Språk, kultur og litteratur (MGBNO401) bygger på Norsk 1 begynnaropplæringa og Norsk 1 mellomsteget. Emnet ligg i 3. studieår, 2. semester og går parallelt med Norsk 2 emne 1 - Språk, kultur og litteratur 1 (MGBNO301).
