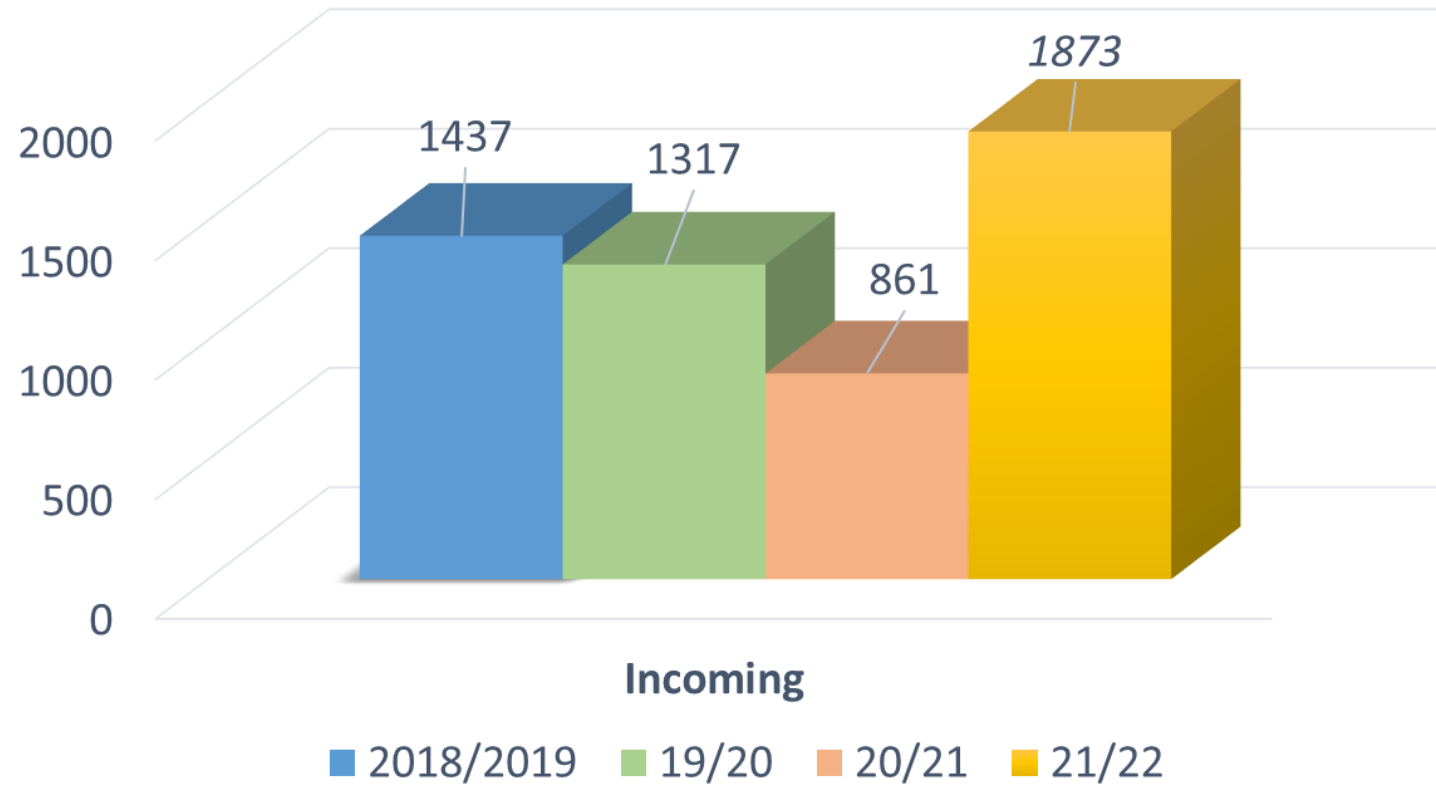

Accommodation

On-campus accommodation is not guaranteed and is limited.

Italian Language Course

The University Language Centre (CLA) offers a free course of 3 ECTS to all exchange students during the mobility period

Buddy Service

Students can request a tutor “buddy” supporting them during they stay in Padova.

Students with disabilities or learning difficulties

Specific initiatives and service organized by the Student Services Office and automatic assignment of Buddy.

Psychological and Psychiatric assistance

Free of charge service available for students who encounter difficulties during their studies, personal problems or unease (anxiety, relationship problems, and academic performance).

University Sport Centre (CUS)

Sport (athletic, rugby, volleyball, basketball, boat races...) both at competitive and amateur level.

ESN - Erasmus Student Network

Association supporting exchange students and organizing activities, trips and parties to promote Italian culture with the aim to create a positive environment where everybody can feel at ease and make new friends.

Theatre

Theatre workshop in Italian as a foreign language for incoming and international students (3 ECTS)

Credit and grading

Unips uses the ECTS credit transfer system.

Grade range: 18-30 (30 cum laude in case of exceptional performance).

Examinations

Exam session at the end of the semester -> 2 exam dates for each course.

It is possible to resit an exam in case of failure or in case that students are not satisfied with the grade.

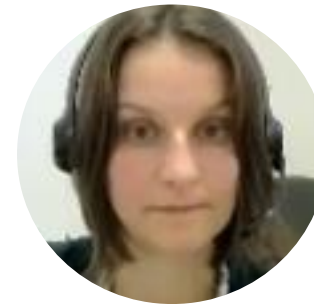
